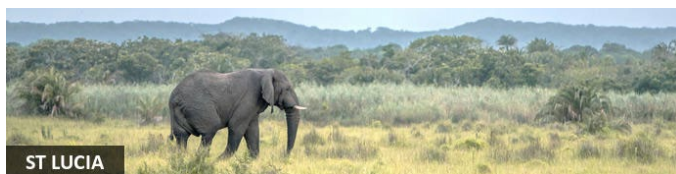

Encircled by the iSimangaliso Wetlands Park, St Lucia is South Africa's first UNESCO World Heritage Site. St Lucia lies on the magnificent St Lucia Estuary which is one of the largest in Africa stretching over 85 kilometres. It features abundant wildlife, pristine natural beauty, and offers a wide range of wonderful activities. This haven of tranquillity offers excellent mountain biking, hiking, bird watching and deep-sea fishing. Visitors can also look forward to thrilling night drive safaris, hippo and crocodile cruises, and many comfortable accommodation options.

Overnight: The St.Lucia EcoLodge

The St.Lucia EcoLodge is nestled between the St. Lucia Estuary, the Indian Ocean, and iSimangaliso Wetland Park, making it an ideal point from which to explore South Africa's first World Heritage Site. The region has an all-around summer, making it comfortable throughout the year. The lodge offers 29 fully air-conditioned units, each with large bedrooms, full bathroom, lounge, fully kitted kitchenette, TV and veranda or balcony. Guests can enjoy a delicious breakfast every morning at the on-site bistro overlooking the lush indigenous garden. This cruise offers scenic views and the opportunity to witness wildlife, namely hippos, crocodiles and birds. In addition, guests can also disembark and go for a guided walk in the bush and spot local wildlife including buffalo, zebra, and antelope.

Day 2: Mseni Beach Lodge, Sodwana Bay

Sodwana Bay

Located on Kwa-Zulu Natal's coast within the iSimangaliso Wetland Park, Sodwana Bay is known primarily as a top diving destination. The Southern Coral Reef is the only tropical dive site in South Africa and one of the few places in the world where dive sites are reached by weaving a path through breaking waves. Divers can enjoy warm water; deserted beaches; exciting coral reefs; and a great diversity of seascapes, marine life and spectacular night dives. In summer, loggerhead and leatherback turtles can be seen nesting on the beaches, and dolphins, manta rays, whales, and black, blue and striped marlin are prevalent here. Other popular activities include boating, angling, fishing, whale watching, snorkelling and canoeing. For those who prefer staying on land, there is still plenty on offer in the form of nature walking, and bird watching, while the more adventurous can try microliting.

Amoray Diving is situated in the iSimangaliso Wetland Park in beautiful Sodwana Bay, giving divers the best possible experience in this pristine UNESCO World Heritage Site. The reefs at Sodwana Bay are named by the distance they are from the Jesser Point launch site. The major reefs are split up into Quarter Mile, 2 Mile Reef, 5 Mile Reef, 7 Mile Reef and 9 Mile Reef, each reef having a dive site. The biodiversity in the area is phenomenal, from big to small. Seasonal visitors include humpback whales and Manta Rays, with dolphins, turtles and whale sharks appearing year-round. Some smaller treasures on offer include paperfish, pipefish, seahorses, nudibranchs, frogfish and many others. The experienced Divemasters are always on hand to ensure the diving is a fantastic experience. Additional amenities and services include a dive school with various PADI courses and accommodation.

Day 6: Kosi Forest Lodge, Kosi Bay

Kosi Bay

Situated just north of Durban along South Africa's scenic coast, Kosi Bay lies only two kilometres from the Mozambique border. It encompasses a pristine system of four lakes that form part of the iSimangaliso Wetland Park and eventually drain via a sandy estuary into the Indian Ocean. Beachgoers can enjoy a calm, quiet beach and a river mouth with exceptionally clear water, home to an abundance of fish species. Other faunas in the area include duikers, hippopotamuses, crocodiles, bull sharks, loggerheads, and leatherback sea turtles – which lay their eggs on the beach – and diverse birdlife. An interesting fact about Kosi Bay is that it is home to the Kosi Palm, which has the largest leaf of any plant in the floral kingdom.

Kosi Forest Lodge is an intimate lodge situated under a canopy of magnificent trees within a tranquil sand forest alongside the Kosi Lakes System, an unspoilt wilderness area that is part of the iSimangaliso World Heritage Park. This 20-bed lodge offers comfortable accommodation in wooden, canvas & thatch cabins, great home cooking and caters for a host of estuarine, beach and wilderness activities. Glamping at its best. A lovely sweeping pool overlooks Lake Shengeza where one can relax on the viewing deck in the shade of Umdoni trees while watching hippos & flamingos in the lake.

Daily guided canoe trips and walks through ancient Raphia Palm Forests are offered at no additional cost. Additional activities are a boat trip exploring this unique system of lakes and channels where one can see hippo, crocodile, rare birds like the Pels Fishing Owl and Palm Nut Vulture, included in this day trip is a picnic on the unspoilt shores of Bhanga Nek beach.
