


Brief Overview


South Africa, Eswatini & Lesotho

Heading to Kasane, take a morning bush walk before enjoying an afternoon boat cruise through Chobe National Park, marvelling at elephant herds and rich birdlife along the riverbanks. Revisting Zimbabwe, you reach Victoria Falls – Mosi-oa-Tunya, the "smoke that thunders." Here you have free days to chase adrenaline thrills like white-water rafting, scenic helicopter flights, or explore the many craft markets and cafés. Departing the Falls, travel south to Hwange National Park for open-vehicle safaris in search of lions, giraffes, buffalo, and more, plus a visit to the Painted Dog Conservation Centre.

Week 4: Matobo, Great Zimbabwe and Kruger

The journey continues to Matobo Hills, a UNESCO World Heritage Site where granite boulders and rock art sites tell ancient stories. If conditions allow, you might track rhinos on foot through dramatic landscapes. Then travel east to the Great Zimbabwe Ruins, featuring 11th - 15th century stone architecture and a once-mighty kingdom. Entering Mapungubwe near the Limpopo River, you visit the Kaoxa Rock Art Shelter before tracking endangered wildlife in Mapesu

You cross into South Africa and the legendary Kruger National Park for dusk and morning safaris that reveal the Big Five and much more. Timbavati brings more unforgettable wildlife moments and before embarking on the scenic Panorama Route, past the Blyde River Canyon, God's Window, and Bourke's Luck Potholes. Round off with a full-day Kruger safari to end your adventure. Returning to Johannesburg, you'll reflect on a journey rich in the endless spirit and wilds of Africa.

Day 1: Masindi - Murchison Falls National Park

We meet the crew and begin our journey toward Uganda's most iconic reserve, Murchison Falls National Park. Here the Nile, one of the world's greatest rivers, is forced through a rocky gap only seven meters wide before crashing into a turbulent pool below. Known locally as Kabarega Falls, this thundering cascade is the park's highlight and a fitting introduction to Uganda's wild beauty. After checking into our lodge in Masindi, our guide provides an evening briefing on the adventures ahead.

Day 2: Budongo Central Forest Reserve

Today we venture into Budongo Forest, East Africa's largest mahogany forest and home to Uganda's largest chimpanzee population. With a specialist guide we trek in search of these primates, whose calls echo through the canopy. Later we enjoy a boat cruise on the Nile, where hippos, crocodiles, and abundant birdlife line the shores. Because chimp permits are limited to 12 per trek, larger groups are divided between morning and afternoon, so activities may alternate.

Day 3: Lake Kikorongo

Heading southwest, we approach Queen Elizabeth National Park. Our overnight lodge sits high on a ridge overlooking Lake Kikorongo, offering sweeping views across the savanna.

Day 4: Lake Bunyonyi

Crossing the Equator again, we descend into the lush highlands surrounding Lake Bunyonyi. Dotted with islands and framed by terraced hillsides, it provides a peaceful base as we prepare for gorilla trekking. Tonight we receive a full briefing.

Day 5: Gorilla Trekking (Lake Bunyonyi)

Few experiences rival the chance to see mountain gorillas in their natural habitat. With only about 650 left, each visit contributes to their protection and supports community initiatives that safeguard their future. Gorilla ranges cross Uganda, Rwanda, and the DRC, so treks may occur in different parks depending on permit availability. Wherever the encounter takes place, the experience is extraordinary.

Day 6: Lake Bunyonyi

Only one trek is undertaken, yet two days are allowed for permit flexibility. On your free day you may explore the lake by canoe, hike local trails, or try mountain biking.

Day 7: Lake Mburo

We travel to Lake Mburo National Park, a small but diverse reserve of rolling hills, savannah, acacia woodland, and wetlands. With more than 350 bird species, including the rare shoebill stork, it is a true birdwatcher's paradise.

Day 8: Kampala

Our journey ends with a return to Kampala, crossing the Equator once more before reaching the capital, where this unforgettable adventure concludes.

Embrace waterside saunters and serenity, from Botswana's untamed Okavango Delta and surrounding parks to the rock art of Tsodilo Hills, travel northwards into Zambia's national parks and Malawi, finishing with tropical paradise in Tanzania's Zanzibar.

Victoria Falls to Stone Town

Week 1: Victoria Falls to the Okavango Delta

Opening with the grand Victoria Falls, you head into Namibia's Zambezi Region, where a riverside lodge and sunset cruise introduce you to diverse inhabitants and birdlife. Onwards, you drive through countryside to Divundu on the Kavango River, embarking on a river cruise to Popa Falls before taking an afternoon safari through Mahangu National Park to spot elephant, buffalo, and antelope.

Entering Botswana, you'll reach the wild fringes of the Okavango Delta, staying in a serene lodge where the natural setting holds hordes of birdlife. A day trip to Tsodilo Hills rounds out the week, famed for its thousands of ancient rock paintings and spiritual heritage.

Week 2: The Delta, Khwai & Chobe

Setting forth to Maun, we head deeper into the wilderness of the Khwai Conservation Area. Here you'll camp in rustic merustyle tents, traverse by mokoro (traditional canoe), and venture on a full-day safari in Moremi Game Reserve, searching for all manner of game across its wetlands and savannah. Regrouping, the journey continues to Nata.

Moving to Chobe National Park, you search its waters by boat, teeming with elephants and hippo. Returning to Zimbabwe to revisit Victoria Falls, choose from a variety of optional adventure activities, wander markets and cafés in town or admire the falls. Transitioning to Zambia, you arrive in Livingstone.

Week 3: Zambia to Malawi

Crossing Zambia's rural heartlands, you'll follow the Great East Road towards Petauke, visiting traditional villages along the way. Continuing to South Luangwa National Park, you'll visit Mulberry Mongoose for locally made crafts and enjoy incredible sunsets over the Luangwa River. A full day is dedicated to discovering this wildlife-rich park, including a sunset drive with potential nocturnal animal sightings.

Then we reach the shores of Lake Malawi in Malawi. Spend the days by its crystal-clear waters, hike to nearby waterfalls, or relax on its white sands. The week rounds off with a night in Mbeya, Tanzania, after leaving Lake Malawi behind.

Week 4: Tanzania to Zanzibar

Tanzania brings a tour of a coffee plantation near Iringa before pausing in Baobab Valley for photos among ancient giants. Reaching Mikumi National Park, book game drives or cultural encounters in this park bordering Africa's largest reserve, Selous. Continuing to the Indian Ocean coast, overnight in Dar es Salaam before Ferrying to Zanzibar.

Arriving in Stone Town, learn of its alleys and history on a guided walk before heading to the island's beaches. A spice tour en route reveals Zanzibar's fragrant plantations, followed by time to swim, snorkel, or unwind in the sun. Finally, return to Stone Town, where the tour concludes after a last breakfast together, leaving you with the choice to end your journey in Nungwi or transfer back to the ferry port, completing a remarkable four-week adventure through Southern and East Africa.











Maun to Nairobi

Week 1: Okavango Delta to Chobe

Your odyssey starts in Maun, meeting your crew before delving into the Khwai Conservation Area for an authentic mobile camp experience among the Okavango waterways. With optional scenic flights and tranquil mokoro (traditional canoe) rides. you'll explore the Delta's dense wilderness.

Venturing into Moremi Game Reserve, you'll spend a full day on thrilling 4x4 safaris searching floodplains and savannah for the resident animals. Nata brings a unique bush lodge where elephants wander its central watering hole.

Continuing to Kasane and Chobe National Park, you'll enjoy a river cruise along the illustrious Chobe River, famed for its many elephant herds and dramatic sunsets.

Week 2: Victoria Falls to South Luangwa

Reaching Zimbabwe, you'll arrive at the massive Victoria Falls, known locally as "Mosi-oa-Tunya" – the smoke that thunders. Choose from a range of activities, from white-water rafting or helicopter flights to browsing craft markets and cafés.

After your stay, transfer to Livingstone in Zambia and journey north to Lusaka. Zambia's rural villages line the road as you continue to Petauke, taking in everyday scenes of local culture.

Next, South Luangwa National Park awaits, presents crafts at Mulberry Mongoose and safaris in one of Africa's greatest wildlife havens, including an afternoon and sunset drive with a chance to see elusive nocturnal creatures.

Week 3: Lake Malawi to Tanzania's Baobab Valley

Leaving Zambia, the route leads to the calm banks of Lake Malawi, an inland sea alive with colourful fish species. Here, you can unwind. swim, hike to scenic waterfalls, or luxuriate in lake life. Moving north along its shoreline, its vivid sunsets remain a highlight.

Entering Tanzania, you overnight in Mbeya. From there, a coffee plantation visit near Iringa offers a taste of East Africa's brews. Ascending through the Great Rift Valley, you'll reach Mikumi National Park, visiting the Baobab Valley, where towering baobab trees reside, en route. This week brings options for game drives or local culture tours, linking southern Tanzania forests to the Indian Ocean coast.


Week 4: Zanzibar & Northern Tanzania

Reaching Dar es Salaam, you'll overnight before boarding the ferry to magical Zanzibar. In Stone Town, roam intricate alleys on a guided walking tour followed by spice-scented markets, en route to the idyllic beaches. Here, white sands and turquoise waters welcome you to swim, snorkel, or recline.

Ferrying inland, you journey upwards through savannah to Moshi and on toward Karatu, a stepping stone to the Ngorongoro Crater and Serengeti National Park. Over two days, you'll explore these legendary safari areas, encountering diverse wildlife across sweeping plains and unique vistas. Finally, the tour wraps up in Arusha before crossing into Kenya to end in Nairobi, reflecting on a month of incredible African landscapes, cultures, and marvellous wildlife encounters.

Victoria Falls to Nairobi

Week 1: Victoria Falls to Botswana's Delta

Your journey begins in Victoria Falls, where you cross into Namibia's verdant Zambezi Region. Settle at a riverside lodge and embark on a sunset cruise spotting hippos, crocs, and birdlife. Travelling through the Caprivi Strip, you reach Divundu on the banks of the Kavango River, admiring Popa Falls and exploring Mahangu National Park, home to elephants, sable, and more.

Crossing into Botswana, to the edges of the Okavango Delta. where peaceful channels, reed-lined banks, and boat cruises set the tone of this incredible ecosystem. A day trip to Tsodilo Hills, known as the "Louvre of the Desert," offers a spiritual and cultural highlight of San rock paintings.

Finally, the week winds down as you head to Maun, then transfer to a meru-style camp within the Khwai Conservation Area, experiencing a mokoro (traditional canoe) excursion that immerses you in the waterways and surrounding culture.

Week 2: Botswana's Wildlife Havens to Zambia

From your Khwai base, we enjoy a full day on safari in Moremi Game Reserve, where wetlands, grasslands, and woodlands attract a dazzling variety of animals. After final sunrise views in Khwai, return through Maun to Nata, where elephants frequent our lodge's unfenced waterhole at your doorstep.

Next is Kasane and Chobe National Park, famous for its herds of elephant, where a river cruise gives astonishing animal sightings. Returning to Zimbabwe, you'll have two days at Victoria Falls to experience Mosi-oa-Tunya. Feel free to relax, partake in thrilling activities or explore its craft markets. We travel through Livingstone, Zambia, before heading to Lusaka, and driving through vibrant markets and countryside along the way.

Week 3: Zambia to the Warm Heart of Africa

Leaving Lusaka behind, your route east takes you through Petauke on the Great East Road, crossing the Luangwa River to South Luangwa National Park. Here you'll witness local craft skills from poacher's snares at Mulberry Mongoose before venturing into the park's thickets and woodland in search of its resident animals. There are exciting optionals, such as a walking safari or jewellery workshop to choose from as well.

Entering Malawi, your base shifts to the shores of Lake Malawi, one of Africa's largest and most biodiverse lakes. Enjoy this area at your leisure - hike the nearby Dwanbazi Waterfall, snorkel its clear waters for kaleidoscopic fish or simply relax along the beaches. We travel north along the lake's shoreline and take the time to admire the sunsets across this vista.



Week 4: Tanzania's Highlands to Zanzibar

As we move on into Tanzania, you overnight at Utengule Coffee Lodge. En route to Iringa we visit a local coffee plantation to sample Tanzanian coffee and learn its trip from plant to cup.

From there, travel to Mikumi National Park, pausing to admire and photograph the magnificent baobabs littering Baobab Valley. Mikumi offers opportunities to book game drives amongst its trees or add more cultural aspects to your tour.

The journey heads east to Dar es Salaam, catching a ferry to reach Stone Town in Zanzibar. You'll be guided through its elaborate alleyways and wooden doors, discovering the dynamic history of this tropical island, from its slave and spice trade roots to landmarks like Freddie Mercury's birthplace.

Alongside this, you'll be introduced to the process of spice farming and the expert harvesters. Two days on the beach offer opportunities for water sports, snorkelling, or simply relax under the warmth of the African sun.

Week 5: Tanzania's Northern Circuit and Beyond

After saying farewell to Zanzibar's beaches, you return to Bagamoyo, a once-thriving port town rich in Swahili culture. From there, the road winds to Moshi, with optional excursions to local coffee plantations or guided cycling tours.

Next, you travel to Karatu, pausing at Mto wa Mbu Market to discover local produce like rice and their famous red bananas. Thus, we begin a highlight of a two-day safari into the Ngorongoro Crater and Serengeti National Park. Surrounded by the crater's mountains, there is a dense and thriving ecosystem that you will roam and witness for most of the day before moving to the vast plains of Serengeti's Seronera region.

Nestled in this grassland, we traverse the grasslands of the Serengeti for an entire day, ensuring spectacular views and unforgettable wildlife encounters. One of our most popular optional activities is a hot air balloon safari, which delivers you deeper into remote and inaccessible areas teeming with wildlife

On your final days, the route returns to Arusha, where you can reminisce about the endless wonders you've seen, before crossing the border into Kenya and finishing this unforgettable experience in Nairobi.

Cape Town to Stone Town

Your journey begins in Cape Town with a final glimpse of Table Mountain before crossing the Cederberg, home of rooibos tea and mountain vistas. Traveling north through Namaqualand, you may see the famous wildflowers in bloom before reaching the banks of the Orange (Gariep) River.

Canoeing on the river is an optional treat before continuing to the rugged landscape of the Fish River Canyon, Africa's largest and the world's second largest canyon. Wander the exceptionally unique Quiver Tree Forest and Giants Playground near Keetmanshoop before entering the vast Namib Desert.

From here we travel to Namib-Naukluft National Park to climb the marvel of Dune 45, explore Deadvlei, and walk the mazes of Sesriem Canyon, falling asleep under a star-filled sky.

Departing the amber dunes, you pause at the Tropic of Capricorn before reaching Swakopmund on the Atlantic coast. Here, time is yours to enjoy the German-colonial architecture, local cafés, or thrilling optional adventures like sandboarding or

Week 2: Etosha to Maun

Continuing north along Namibia's Skeleton Coast, pause at Wlotzkasbaken and the Lichen Fields, before hiking the Brandberg mountains to view ancient San rock paintings among its steep crags.

Moving on, we begin our wildlife experience with Etosha National Park. Spanning vast salt pans and bush, Etosha rewards visitors with outstanding wildlife viewing due to its unusually flat and arid landscape, known for its elephant herds and black rhino. We have a full day and afternoon safari on our vehicle to search Etosha's watering holes for animals.

Leaving Etosha, we drive towards the Kavango River at Divundu. Cruise the peaceful waters in search of birdlife and hippo. Enjoy an optional game drive in the diverse gem of Mahangu National Park.

Crossing into Botswana, the town of Maun is your springboard into the Okavango Delta

Week 3: Okavango Delta & Victoria Falls

Moving to Khwai Conservation Area, you'll stay in a mobile fly camp within this verdant landscape and explore the waterways by mokoro, delving into this striking biome. A full-day game drive in Moremi Game Reserve delivers wonderful animal sightings across wetlands and savanna.

Next, journey to Nata through the open salt pans before reaching Kasane and Chobe National Park, where a river cruise reveals herds of elephants and hippos within its waters and along its banks.

Week 4: South Luangwa & Malawi

Arriving at South Luangwa National Park, you can support local crafts made from recovered poaching snares at Mulberry Mongoose before settling beside the Luangwa River. Partake in a range of optional activities, such as a jewellery workshop or safari walk, before an iconic African sunset drive that presents the opportunity to spot elusive nocturnal species.

Heading in to Malawi, you arrive at the shores of Lake Malawi, one of the world's largest and most biodiverse lakes. Choose to spend time enjoying the warm-hearted hospitality, perhaps hiking to Dwanbazi Waterfall, snorkelling the azure lake for colourful fish or take a moment to relax shoreside. We continue north along the lake, then cross into Tanzania for an overnight at Utengule Coffee Lodge.



Visiting a working coffee plantation, you'll sample the brews and view the process, before driving into Tanzanian highlands, pausing in the Baobab Valley on your way to Mikumi National Park. Here, optional game drives and cultural tours give you the chance to delve into the forests for animal sightings and explore local traditions before heading to the coast.

From Dar es Salaam, we travel by ferry to Stone Town, a hotpot of Arab, Portuguese and Swahili culture, known for its spice trading and historical roots. After a guided walking tour of Stone Town's architecturally intricate alleys and doorways, we are whisked into Zanzibar's flourishing spice markets and harvesting of these coveted aromatics.

Afterwards, we turn to Zanzibar's idyllic beaches for two days of bliss. From snorkelling and diving to reclining along its sands and beach bars, there is an activity to suit any taste and plenty to do. Savouring a final breakfast together, with the option to end your tour in Stone Town or at the beach, we bid farewell to one another while we carry home the tapestry of memories made on this African journey.



Cape Town to Nairobi

Week 1: Cape Town to the Namib Desert

Bidding farewell to Cape Town and Table Mountain, you head into the roughened Cederberg, famed for rooibos tea and its escarpments. Namaqualand gives a taste of desert landscapes, turning ablaze with wildflowers in spring, before you reach the Orange River. Take an optional canoe trip in the dawn before continuing to Fish River Canyon and its view that carves into

Quiver Tree Forest and Giants Playground provide stunningly unique landscapes on the arid horizon. Heading into the heart of the desert, we enter Namib-Naukluft National Park. Climb Dune 45 around sunrise, admire Deadvlei's ghostly pans, and wander through Sesriem Canyon, then continue onward to Swakopmund, a German-colonial town where sand dunes embrace the Atlantic Sea and offer thrilling activities abound.

Week 2: From Swakopmund to Etosha

After Swakopmund, you'll continue along the Skeleton Coast to Wlotzkasbaken and the Lichen Fields before traversing the rugged Brandberg mountains to visit prehistoric rock paintings huddled under its cliff-faces.

Our next destination is an remarkable wildlife experience in Etosha National Park, known for its lunar-esque salt pans. watering holes and abundant game. A full day of game drives can reveal everything from elephants marked in clay to the critically endangered black rhinos. The next day features a secondary chance for sightings on an afternoon drive.

Departing Etosha, we exchange salt pans for the the banks of the Kavango River at Divundu. A peaceful river cruise and an optional Mahangu National Park drive reveal hippos, crocodiles, and big game. From there, we cross into Botswana to reach Maun.

Week 3: Okavango Delta & Victoria Falls

Settling within the heart of the Okavango Delta, we leave our vehicles for meru-style camps in Khwai Conservation Area. Here, you'll embark on a traditional mokoro canoe with an local guide to traverse channels alive with birdlife and wildlife. In Moremi Game Reserve, a full day on safari allows for fantastic viewing of Botswana's inhabitants.

Heading to Nata, we arrive at Kasane and glide onto the Chobe River to look for its elephant herds and peeking hippos. Jumping across the border to Zimbabwe, we sightsee the aweinspiring Victoria Falls for two days, with many opportunities to explore the local culture or take on exhilarating optionals.

Moving on, we travel into Zambia, beginning in Livingstone and arriving in Zambia's dynamic capital, Lusaka.



Further east, South Luangwa National Park awaits us. We visit local crafters, who make jewellery from recovered poacher's snares at Mulberry Mongoose and soak up sunsets over the Luangwa River. Partake in various optional activities before exploring the park on safari in the setting light of the sun, with a chance to spot the region's elusive nocturnal species.

Leaving Zambia, enter Malawi to reach Lake Malawi's pristine shores. For two days, you can decide between swimming, hiking to Dwanbazi Waterfall, or merely reclining on sandy shorelines, soaking in the freshwater's calm. As you continue north along the lake, sample the warmth of Malawian hospitality before crossing into Tanzania, overnighting at Utengule Coffee Lodge.

Week 5: Tanzania and Zanzibar

Learn all about coffee farming at a local plantation in Iringa, sampling their brews before continuing through the baobabdotted valleys. Arriving at Mikumi National Park, you may book optional safaris or cultural encounters in a region that connects with the Selous ecosystem.

From the coast of Dar es Salaam, we ferry to Zanzibar and uncover Stone Town's intricate alleys, spice markets, and centuries-old trading history. A spice farm visit reveals cloves and other aromatic treasures before you continue to Zanzibar's famous beaches for two days of pure relaxation, snorkelling, and sunshine, ensuring a moment of bliss in this idyllic place.

Week 6: The Ngorongoro Crater and Serengeti

After returning to the mainland, you'll continue to Bagamoyo with a mix of Swahili and colonial history, then further inland toward Moshi near Kilimanjaro. Passing eclectic villages, we glimpse the rhythms of rural Tanzanian life before reaching Karatu. Thus begins our decent into the globally renowned Ngorongoro Crater, an extensive habitat that houses a prolific amount of wildlife between its ridges.

We move into the Seronera region of the Serengeti's endless grassland, culminating in a full day of roaming this iconic savannah with the opportunity to book a hot air balloon flight over the region.

Finally, we return to Arusha with experiences to last a lifetime, crossing into Kenya to wrap up your exhilarating journey across

Victoria Falls to Nairobi

Week 1: Victoria Falls to the Caprivi and Okavango

We begin in Zimbabwe, heading for Namibia's Zambezi (Caprivi) Strip. Settling in at our lodge, you'll unwind on a sunset cruise along the Zambezi. Continuing through lush plains, the route leads to Divundu on the Kavango River. Popa Falls sets the stage for a cruise past crocodiles and birds, before a game drive in Mahangu National Park brings big game sightings.

Entering Botswana and the Okavango Delta, you are surrounded by reeded woodland, capturing the mosaic of light on a sunset cruise along the Delta.

The following day trip to Tsodilo Hills delves into cultural heritage with over 4,500 rock paintings. You'll head southward into Maun, retreating into the Khwai Conservation Area for two nights amongst the wetland wilderness in meru-style tents, before gliding across the waters in mokoro canoes.

Week 2: Botswana's Delta and Victoria Falls

From Khwai, we enter Moremi Game Reserve, a full day's game drive revealing the incredible wildlife within its various biomes. After sunrise we reunite with our transport, and continue to Nata, and a lodge with a waterhole frequented by elephants.

After a morning walk in bushveld, Chobe National Park brings an afternoon boat cruise along its waterways, where elephant herds mingle on its banks.

A bucket list highlight, Victoria Falls in Zimbabwe is our next destination, offering adventure, views and fun to suit any taste. Transitioning into Zambia, we pause in Livingstone before travelling east to Lusaka.

Week 3: Zambia's Wild Parks and Malawi


Next stop: South Luangwa National Park, where you'll visit Mulberry Mongoose for local crafts and witness fiery sunsets on the Luangwa River. Safaris here reveal abundant wildlife, with options for night drives or walking safaris in dense shrubbery.

Leaving Zambia, you reach Malawi's Lake Malawi, one of Africa's great freshwater jewels, where you can relax, swim, or hike to Dwanbazi Waterfall. The journey north continues along the lakeshore, then crosses into Tanzania with a night at Utengule Coffee Lodge.

Week 4: Tanzania and Zanzibar

We start this week with a coffee plantation visit to sample local beans. Travelling through the baobab-dotted valleys, you arrive in Mikumi National Park, part of the great Selous ecosystem, with chances for game drives or cultural tours.

You overnight near Dar es Salaam, ready for your island adventure. Hop the ferry to Zanzibar's Stone Town, rich in Swahili culture and spice-trading history. Explore labyrinthine alleys and visit Freddie Mercury's birthplace on a guided



Week 5: Serengeti to Masai Mara

After a final day in Zanzibar, we return inland and to Bagamoyo, a coastal town steeped in the legacy of trade routes. From there you move through savannah landscapes and villages, arriving in Moshi at the foot of Kilimanjaro, with opportunities to visit coffee plantations or enjoy cultural tours.

Crossing through the Rift Valley, you reach Karatu near the Ngorongoro Crater, with time to explore Mto wa Mbu market and prepare for your classic safari experience. Spend a morning on the crater floor, then continue to the Serengeti's Seronera region, surrounded by rolling grasslands and wildlife. Game drives in the Serengeti offer unforgettable moments among wildebeest and the Big Five before you head to Arusha and cross into Kenya.

Nairobi provides a break before your Masai Mara adventure begins in safari vehicles. Overnight in the heart of the Mara, wreathed by endless plains and animals.

Week 6: Kenya and Uganda

In the Masai Mara, two days of superb game drives reveal everything from leopards to hippos. Heading north, you reach Lake Nakuru National Park, famous for flamingos and rhino.

Entering Uganda, you travel to Jinja on the Nile, with adventure activities abound, from rafting to quad biking. The route then takes you to Murchison Falls, where the Nile crashes through a narrow gorge.

A chimpanzee trek in Budongo Forest reveals East Africa's largest mahogany forest, and you explore Queen Elizabeth National Park with accommodation near Lake Kikorongo.

Week 7: Gorilla Trekking

Heading south to Lake Bunyonyi, you prepare for a once-ina-lifetime gorilla trek, learning about conservation efforts that protect these gentle giants. Gorilla permits vary by location, so flexibility is built in for trekking days. Free time at the lake offers canoeing, mountain biking, or village visits.

Next, cross to Lake Mburo, known for birdlife and rolling savannahs, before returning to Jinja for another dose of Nile adventures, ending with a sunset cruise.

Moving on through the Rift Valley, you visit Eldoret and then Nairobi, reflecting on countless memories made across some of Africa's greatest natural and cultural landscapes.

Cape Town to Nairobi

Week 1: Cape Town to the Namib Desert

Departing Cape Town and Table Mountain, you cross the Cederberg mountains known for rooibos tea. Head north into Namaqualand's wildflower-strewn desert to the Orange River, featuring an optional canoe trip along its waters.

From there, visit the massive Fish River Canyon and the boulders of the Quiver Tree Forest and Giants Playground. Continuing into the Namib, you settle at the edge of the dunes and rise early to climb Dune 45, exploring Sossusvlei, Deadvlei and Sesriem Canyon, before reaching Swakopmund, where ocean breezes meet desert sands.

Week 2: Namibia's North to Etosha

After enjoying Swakopmund's German-inspired cafés and adventure activities, head north via Wlotzkasbaken and the Lichen Fields. Visit Brandberg, hiking to its rock paintings, before moving toward Etosha National Park, one of Africa's greatest wildlife reserves. With vast salt pans, acacia woodlands, and waterholes, Etosha brings safaris in search of elephant, lion, giraffe, and many other species, with time is built in to relax at camp to soak in the environment.

Week 3: From Etosha to Botswana's Delta

Journeying east to Divundu to the banks of the Kavango River, a river cruise reveals hippos, crocodiles, and abundant birdlife, with an option for a Mahangu National Park game drive.

Cross into Botswana and overnight in Maun, preparing for your Delta delve. Khwai Conservation Area offers fly camping and mokoro canoe excursions in the Okavango's channels.

Venture into Moremi Game Reserve on a full-day game drive across wetlands and savannahs. Travel through the salt pans to Nata, before reaching Chobe National Park for a river cruise among elephants at sunset.

Week 4: Victoria Falls and Zambia

Arriving at Victoria Falls, "the smoke that thunders," choose to marvel at this natural wonder and dive into adventure activities or explore local craft markets.

Transferring to Zambia, Livingstone offers the last of the falls before driving to Lusaka en route to Petauke, passing villages and farmland. At South Luangwa National Park, visit Mulberry Mongoose for locally made crafts, and sojourn on sunset safaris and a walking safari, with opportunities to sight nocturnal creatures in the veld.

Week 5: Lake Malawi to Tanzania

Transitioning into Malawi, be wreathed by the fresh waters of Lake Malawi, a haven for swimming and lakeside relaxation, with an optional hike to Dwanbazi Waterfall. Continue north along the lakeshore before entering Tanzania and visiting Utengule Coffee Lodge to sample home-grown beans.





Week 6: Zanzibar and the Tanzanian Coast

From Dar es Salaam, you ferry to Zanzibar, where Stone Town's alleys and spice markets reveal centuries of Swahili heritage. Embarking on a guided tour of its highlights you'll stop at spice plantations before indulging in beach delights. Several free days allow for water sports, relaxing on white-sand beaches, or exploring the local scene.

Returning to the mainland, continue to Bagamoyo before heading inland toward Moshi, passing traditional villages framed by Kilimanjaro's foothills.

Week 7: Tanzania's North to Kenya

The route crosses to Karatu, after perusing Mto wa Mbu market, and whisks you to the Ngorongoro Crater for a spectacular morning safari on the crater floor.

Next is the Serengeti's Seronera region, presenting safaris through prolific wildlife savannah, before returning to Arusha and crossing into Kenya.

Overnight in Nairobi before an astonishing safari into the Masai Mara, where rolling grasslands and shrubbery hide many splendid animal sightings.

Week 8: Kenya to Uganda

Two days in the Masai Mara offer prime game viewing, while Lake Nakuru National Park awaits with flamingos, rhino, and lions.

Cross into Uganda, reaching Jinja, where the Nile flows from Lake Victoria, offering rafting and quad-biking. Continue to Murchison Falls National Park for dramatic waterfalls and Budongo Forest's chimpanzees, followed by Queen Elizabeth National Park near Lake Kikorongo.

Week 9: Gorilla Encounters and Uganda's Lakes

Lake Bunyonyi is our base for the resplendent gorilla trek, a true bucket-list experience, or the option for Golden Monkey trekking. Multiple days allow for permit flexibility, with canoeing or local hikes available on your free days.

Then continue to Lake Mburo, known for its rich birdlife, before returning to Jinja to relax or pursue final adventures on the Nile.

Week 10: Return through Kenya

From Jinja, head north to Eldoret across the Great Rift Valley, then onward to Nairobi. Closing our weeks of wildlife, vistas, culture, and thrilling moments, reminisce on your epic odyssey across Africa for years to come.

























































